The first meeting of the new Carolinas Chapter board of directors meeting was held on October 31. The first order of business was to elect Wes Schrom to the position of assistant judging chairman. We now have a full slate of elected officers. In addition, Sandi Aue accepted an appointment as the membership manager. She performed this function for the MAC chapter before moving to North Carolina.

Sandi is now responsible for maintaining the membership roster. All renewals and dues will go to her. There will be a separate communication dealing with renewing memberships.

The new membership list will be available in January. There is also a new membership/renewal form to ensure the information we have is up to date. I am positive you will hear from her more than once over the next year.

A list of activities for the first half of 2011 was developed and is reported elsewhere in the newsletter.

The Board looked at the requirements, and we believe we do most of the things already. The essential part is the record keeping. Some of the requirements entail participation by a certain percentage of the membership in activities like having a car judged.

As a part of organizing the first board of directors meeting, it sank in just how spread out the chapter membership is and the need to allow travel time to events. For that reason, the Christmas open house is 1:00 to 4:00 to allow people time to come and not end up getting home really late. We are considering having regional representatives to coordinate events in their areas.

Twenty-six people attended a tech session at Dick Bridges' new garage on November 13. It is a most impressive facility, complete with shop, display for many cars, soda fountain and lounge/entertainment area. Dick Whittington discussed the use of the NRCS Technical Discussion Board and Brian McIntyre presented photos of the building of the 1963 pilot cars.

Update on the 1992: I have a long list of things to do from the National, two regionals and two chapter meets. I am in the process of prioritizing them in preparation for the 2011 National in Novi. Winter is good time to take care of the more long-lead things. I just need to be careful not to procrastinate too much.

However, you can be sure that the car will show up at the spring meet to help achieve the five percent of member cars judged, a requirement for the chapter Top Flight. I need to talk Bob Young into bringing his '91.

# Janet Kennedy Outlines Plans for Chapter Top-Flight Participation

First and foremost, happy holidays! As odd as it sounds to be saying that this early, the fact is that the holidays are just around the corner! So ready or not, here they come!

While everyone is preparing for the holiday season, the Carolinas Chapter Board of Directors is preparing for a new year and we're excited! Plans for 2011 are already underway, and it is our resolution that the Carolinas Chapter will attain Top Flight status in 2011. To become eligible for this national award, we must complete eight required activities and six variable activities.

I have outlined below both required and variable activities that need to be accomplished and reported in order to attain Top Flight Status.

## Required activities

- host at least one chapter judging meet during the program year
- host one chapter technical seminar during the program year
- conduct one chapter judging school during the program year
- conduct one chapter membership meeting during the program year
- conduct one chapter charitable event during the program year (does not have to be Corvette-related)
- conduct one chapter road tour during the program year
- conduct one chapter social event during the program year
- maintain chapter website linked to [www.ncrs.org](http://www.ncrs.org)

## Variable activities (minimum of 6)

- 5% of members have a car Flight judged at a chapter or regional judging meet
- six technical articles written by chapter members and published in the quarterly newsletter
- minimum of 15% of members and/or family members must judge or tabulate at the chapter or hosted regional judging meet(s)
- minimum of 15% of members drive their Corvettes to chapter meet or hosted regional meet
- 5% of members participate in a road tour
- 20% of chapter members attend at least one chapter function during the program year
- set up an NCRS display at a non-NCRS car event to promote NCRS and encourage NCRS registration
- chapter donates a minimum of \$100 to a 501-3C charity

Now that you know the chapter's New Year's resolution, make yours! Mark your calendar for the dates of our activities (See schedule on Page 1) and let one of your resolutions be to help the Carolinas chapter attain its resolution—a Top Flight Award at the National Convention!

We have a busy schedule next year and your participation is critical. Being a member of any organization is easy. Being an **active** part of an organization requires commitment. The Chapter Board is committed to its members, please be committed to us!

## Just exactly what is the Top Flight Program?

In reading Janet Kennedy's column above, many of you may wonder what is a Chapter Top Flight? Those who have attended a national convention have seen the various chapter representatives go up and receive their banners to proudly show their status.

Several years ago NCRS began awarding chapter-of-the-year status to one chapter in each size category (small, medium, large) that had met certain criteria. Chapters competed with each other in getting member participation in chapter and regional events. Did you know that the Carolinas Chapter won this award twice: outright in 1998, and in 2001 it tied with the Southeast.

In 2005 NCRS changed the format to match the Flight awards for cars. New guidelines were issued, and any chapter that has attained these is recognized as a Top Flight Chapter (or Second or Third if it doesn't quite reach perfection). Just like the car awards, every chapter competes against the standard, not with each other. There is no limit to how many chapters earn this yearly.

At that time, we chose not to participate because of the small percentage of our membership who attended and volunteered at meets. Since its inception, the percentages have been adjusted, and our chapter's membership is now smaller.

The new board of directors has taken another look at the program and decided that it is feasible for us to participate. Peruse the requirements in Janet's article

and note that we are already doing all but one of the required activities and some of the variables.

But we must have those technical articles for this newsletter! That is a biggie. I remember only one or two of those in the past five years. Now we must have a minimum.

The October issue already had a request for these. I repeat that and now it is more urgent. I know that all of you have fixed or restored something on these cars. Share your knowledge and expertise with fellow members: save them time, money, and frustration.

Let's all get behind the chapter and see that we receive a Top Flight banner in 2012.
