POLICY NOTE:

We have always had difficulty in determining the criteria for refunds from events. The CCNCRS Board has adopted the following policy on refunds:

1. Before deadline - full refund all areas
2. After registration deadline but before show, there is no refund on registration. The car owner must notify someone he cannot make it. Car fee and meal fee can be applied to CCNCRS dues or the owner has the next two CCNCRS judging meets to show with no judging fee (regular registration applies). Failure to notify the chapter that he / she cannot attend negates any refund or application of monies.
3. As always a death, or other unforeseen circumstance is grounds for a refund or full credit toward CCNCRS dues for chapter members.
